- A recommendation was made to consolidate US History 1 and 2 into one course. Students will take US History as sophomores and in their junior year, students will take a civics class
- The new graduation requirement for the class of 2026 will be one course in US History and one course in Civics and Government
- Mr. Paige would like to add Physical Science as a new course for sophomores, juniors and seniors
